### **Irving Penn: Summer of Love**

Major retrospective of one of the 20th century's leading photographers features San Francisco's 1967 Summer of Love. Widely regarded as one of the 20th century's greatest photographers, Penn was renowned for his pared-down aesthetic, exemplary printmaking, and artistic experimentation.

A regular contributor to *Vogue* magazine for more than six decades, he revolutionized fashion photography in the post-war period, positioning models against neutral backdrops. Best known for his psychologically penetrating portraits, Penn was a prolific artist whose career spanned 70 years. Organized by The Metropolitan Museum of Art and presented exclusively on the West Coast at the de Young Museum, the exhibition brings together approximately 175 works. Exhibition curator Emma Acker is forgoing the usual fee charged when a curator leads a tour, as opposed to a docent. She is very authoritative and entertaining. This is a truly special opportunity!





## **Q&A** with Gaye LeBaron

**Historian & Celebrity Author** 



Sonoma County Woman of the Year, 2015

Renowned *Press Democrat* columnist, historian, author, humorist, and Saddle Club member Gaye LeBaron is coming to Lunch & Learn on Thursday, May 16<sup>th</sup>. After several years as a reporter, Gaye wrote her first column for *The Press Democrat* in 1959 and was the daily columnist until her semi-retirement in 2001. At that time, she continued to contribute a "historical perspective" column twice monthly, fully retiring in 2022. Across an extraordinary 65-year career, Gaye told the stories of Sonoma County.

Gaye is the author, with three other researchers, of a two-volume local history, "Santa Rosa, a 19th Century Town," and "Santa Rosa a 20th Century Town," and, with Vermont author Bart Casey, "The Wonder Seekers of Fountaingrove," which is a history of Santa Rosa's 19<sup>th</sup> century Utopia.

She lectured for 35 years on Sonoma County history in SRJC's Community Education program and has taught several courses for SSU's Osher Lifelong Learning Institute. Gaye's letters and papers from some 40 years as a daily columnist are archived in Special Collections at the Schulz Library at SSU. What a treasure she is to our club and our community!
