

Major retrospective of one of the 20th century's leading photographers features San Francisco's 1967 Summer of Love. Widely regarded as one of the 20th century's greatest photographers, Penn was renowned for his pared-down aesthetic, exemplary printmaking, and artistic experimentation.
A regular contributor to Vogue magazine for more than six decades, he revolutionized fashion photography in the post-war period, positioning models against neutral backdrops.
