

In a 35-year career in the U.S. Air Force and the Federal government, Mark has served as an intelligence officer at assignments abroad, at the National Security Agency, and at the Pentagon. He also served for 14 years in the field of civil aviation security including as one of the original cadre of Transportation Security Administration (TSA) Federal Security Directors after 9/11. He went on to become Director of Counterterrorism Policy at the Department of Homeland Security and concluded his career as the senior specialist in domestic intelligence and counterterrorism at the Congressional Research Service, providing members of Congress and their staffs with non-partisan policy analysis.

Additionally, he is involved in academia as an educator at the Santa Rosa Junior College's Wine Studies Program and sits on the board of the SRJC Foundation. For over thirty years, Mr. Traverso has been an adjunct faculty member teaching classes about the wines of Italy, professional wine judging, marketing and sales. He also was a former associate of the executive leadership board for the Department of Viticulture and Enology at UC Davis. Traverso currently leads food and wine tours throughout the major wine growing regions of Italy to compliment and further his teachings.
