He also served for 14 years in the field of civil aviation security including as one of the original cadre of Transportation Security Administration (TSA) Federal Security Directors after 9/11. He went on to become Director of Counterterrorism Policy at the Department of Homeland Security and concluded his career as the senior specialist in domestic intelligence and counterterrorism at the Congressional Research Service, providing members of Congress and their staffs with non-partisan policy analysis.
