Meet the 12 Candidates for WOSC's January 2023 Board Election Candidate Forum on Wednesday, November 30th 5:30 -7:00pm

The Club's Nominating Committee is sponsoring a Meet the Candidates gathering of those candidates running for election to WOSC's Board of Directors. Members are invited to come and meet and greet the candidates on Wednesday, November 30th from 5:30 until 7:00pm.

The Nominating Committee is pleased to present a large and diverse slate of candidates for six (6) open seats on WOCS's Board of Directors. The candidates are, in alphabetical order by first name: Barbara Katona, Cristie Marcus, Doug Pavese, Fred Merrill, Herbert Inestroza, James Henderson, John Meislahn, Mark Randol, Pam Kersch, Scott Bartley, Steve Olsen, and Tom Hinde. Note that a Board member once elected serves a three-year term. Also note that only proprietary members will be eligible to cast a vote in this election of Directors.

Since we have so many candidates - and in the interest of time - the November 30 gathering will not include any individual Q&A debate time. Our goal is to put faces with names and give each person 3 to 5 minutes to introduce themselves and state why they believe they should be elected to join the Board of Directors. The order in which each candidate will speak will be chosen by lot that evening, with each candidate informed of his/her place beforehand.

Ballots for voting will be mailed to proprietary members in advance of the meeting, as established by our Bylaws. The new Board will be announced and introduced at our Annual General Meeting which will take place on Tuesday evening, January 17, 2023.
